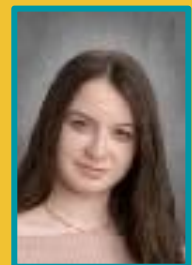
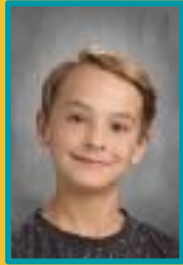
The team should be incredibly proud of their performance—an exciting, competitive weekend full of positives!!

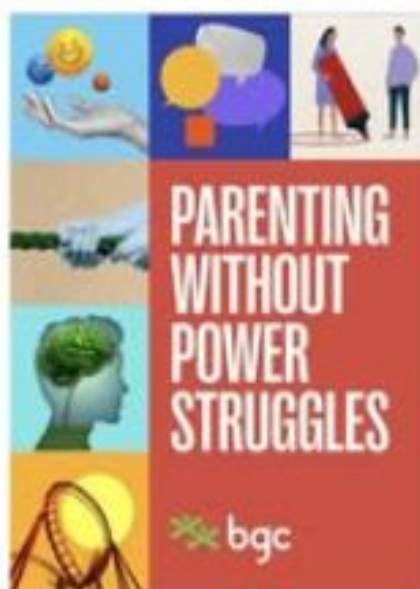
