New Semester - Fresh Start

We have now officially completed our first half of the year and have started semester two. Report cards for semester one are available on the PowerSchool website, and they provide a good overview of how the first part of the year has gone. The teacher comments are meant to be a helpful insight for you into your child's progress as well, and we have parent-teacher interviews coming up in March, which are another good opportunity for connection.

Going forward, the start of the second semester provides an opportunity for a fresh start for students, as our report card grades reset for the final half of the year as we move on to new learner outcomes in new units of study. With that in mind, it is also a good time to touch on the important connection between attendance at school and student academic success. Having good attendance habits (not missing more than 10% of school days a year) is one of the most important ways we can ensure students can find success as learners at school, and going forward as members of society. When students miss school, it often leads to worry over what they have missed and difficulties catching up with the material that they were away for. TIPS FOR PARENTS

- Prioritize school!
- Communicate the importance of regular school attendance.
- Have regular evening and homework routines.
- Schedule family events with our school calendar in mind.
- Try to make appointments during non-school hours when possible.
- Reach out to your child's teacher with any questions or concerns about attendance.

We understand your child will be away at times because of illness and other reasons.

Our priority is to eliminate unnecessary absences so that your child can learn, connect and succeed in school!

DID YOU KNOW?

Research shows that missing 10% of school negatively affects a student's academic performance.

> Attendance in school is compulsory in Alberta for everyone between the ages of 6 and 16.

Students who attend school regularly have the opportunity to participate more fully in learning activities which increases the likelihood of successfully completing high school.

Missing
2 days of school each
month or 20 days each
year starting in Grade 1
is equivalent to missing
a full year of schooling
by grade 10.

Supporting Parents of Teenagers as they Navigate the Challenges of Adolescence






ABOUT THIS CLASS
